

Certificate of Composition.

I John Henry Agar, Commissioner, duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act passed in the second and third years of the Reign of King William the Fourth, entitled "an Act to Amend three Acts passed respectively in the fourth, fifth, seventh and eighth years of the Reign of his late Majesty King George the Fourth, providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland and to make such Compositions permanent" to ascertain and fix the true and just amount of Composition, for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable in the united Parishes of Magourney and Kilcoleman in the Diocese of Cloyne in the County of Cork. Do hereby Certify, that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever in said united Parishes of Magourney and Kilcoleman is ~~Six Hundred and Eighty four Pounds~~ £684 by the year which entire sum of Six Hundred and Eighty four Pounds Sterling is due and payable to the Rev. Henry Johnson, as Rector and Vicar of said united Parishes.

And I do further Certify that the average price of Wheat being the Corn principally grown in said County during the period of seven years, ending the ~~1<sup>st</sup> of November 1834~~ is one Pound twelve Shillings and ten pence per Barrel.
