

2<sup>d</sup> & 3<sup>d</sup> William 4<sup>th</sup> Chap 119.

I, Bourke White, Commissioner duly appointed and Sworn, under and by virtue of an Act made in the second and third year of the reign of King William the Fourth, Chap. 119, entitled, "An Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the fourth, fifth, and in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of his late Majesty King George the Fourth, providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland and to make such Compositions permanent," to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded, or payable, within the Parish of Mahoonagh, in the County of Limerick, and Diocese of Limerick, do hereby Certify, that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is Five Hundred Pounds, <sup>the</sup> by the Year, and which Sum of Five Hundred Pounds, <sup>is</sup> due and payable to the Reverend Thomas Locke, as a Composition for the Tithe claimable by him as Rector of the said Parish.

And I do further Certify, that the average prices of Wheat, Barley, and Oats, being the Corn principally grown in said County, for the period of seven years ending the first day of November one thousand eight hundred and thirty, are, for Wheat, one pound ten Shillings and three pence halfpenny for barrel of twenty Stone; for Barley fifteen Shillings and five pence for barrel of sixteen Stone, and for Oats, eleven Shillings and nine pence three farthings for barrel of fourteen Stone. Given under my hand this twenty second day of April one thousand eight hundred and thirty three.
