

Tithe Composition

I Silvester Ruit having been duly appointed & sworn Commissioner under & by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the Reign of King George the fourth intituled an Act to provide for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time, and by virtue of an Act passed in the second & third years of the Reign of his Majesty King William the fourth intituled an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the fourth, fifth, & in the seventh, & eighth, years of the Reign of his late Majesty King George the fourth, providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, & to make such Compositions permanent, & to ascertain & fix a true & just Composition, for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded, or payable within the Parish of Mainham, in the County of Kildare, (Do hereby Certify that the true & just Amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever, within the said Parish is One hundred & twenty four pounds, four shillings, & one penny halfpenny, Stg. by the year, and that the whole of said Sum is due & payable to the Rev.^d William Parsons Incumbent, as a Composition for the Tithe claimable by him as Owner of
