of which sum, £98^{..}6^{..}2 by the year are due and
payable to the Honble Baron Tottel as impropriator and the
sum of £9^{..}13 due and payable to the Rev^d. Wickham
O'Pharrell as Vicar of said parish

And we do further certify that the average
price of wheat being the corn principally grown
in such County for the period of seven years
