providing for the establishing of composition for Tithes in Ireland  
and to make such composition permanent to ascertain and fix a just composition  
for all Tithes arising growing yielded or payable in the parish of Marlinstown  
in the County of South - I do hereby certify that the true and just amount of  
composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is Twenty Pounds, Nine  
Shillings and One penny Sterling by the year of which sum of Twenty Pounds,  
Nine Shillings and one penny, Forty Pounds, Nineteen Shillings and two pence  
is due and payable to Robert Hall Esq<sup>r</sup> as lay impropriator, and Twenty-nine  
Pounds, Nine Shillings and Eleven pence <sup>to</sup> <sup>the</sup> Rev<sup>d</sup> John Jones as Vicar

I do further certify that the average price of Wheat (being the  
principal ~~crop~~ grown in said County) for the seven years ending 1<sup>st</sup>  
November 1830, is One pound Twelve Shillings, and ten pence halfpenny  
by the Barrel.
