I do hereby certify that the true and just amount
of composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is
Seventy pounds nine shillings and one penny sterling by the
year - of which sum of seventy pounds nine shillings and one
penny - Forty pounds nineteen shillings and two pence is due
and payable to Robert Hall Esq^r as lay impropriator, and
Twenty nine pounds nine shillings and eleven pence to the Rev^d
John Jones as vicar

I do further certify that the average price of Wheat
(being the principal Corn grown in said County) for the seven years
ending 1st November 1830 is one pound Twelve shillings and ten
pence halfpenny by the barrell
