

We Thomas Smyth and Richard Ryan Commissioners duly  
appointed and sworn, under and by virtue of an Act made  
in the 10th year, of the Reign of King George the Fourth  
intituled, "An Act to provide for the establishing of compositions  
for tithes in Ireland, for a limited time," to ascertain and fix a  
true and just composition, for all tithes, arising growing  
yielded, or payable, within the parish of Mayno in the County  
of Westmeath, do hereby certify that the true and just amount  
of composition for all tithes whatever, within the said parish, is  
Two hundred and twenty two pounds  $\text{£}$  by the year, - of which  
Sum of Two hundred and twenty two pounds  $\text{£}$  five ninth  
parts being one hundred and twenty three pounds six shillings  
and eight pence, are due and payable to the Reverend Chaworth  
Broune as a composition for the tithe claimable by him as Vicar  
of the said parish, and the remaining four ninth parts,  
being Ninety eight pounds thirteen shillings and four pence,  
are due and payable to the most Noble the Marquis of  
Westmeath, as a composition for the tithe claimable by him  
as owner of the Rectorial tithes of said parish.

And we do further certify, that the average price of  
Oats, being the corn principally grown, in such County,  
for the period of seven years, ending on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of  
November 1825, is fifteen shillings, and two pence farthing,  
per Barrel.
