

We Thomas Smyth and Richard Ryan Commissioners, duly appointed and sworn, under and by virtue, of an Act, made in the Fourth year of the Reign, of King George the Fourth, Intituled, "An Act to provide for the establishing of Compositions for tithes, in Ireland for a limited time," to ascertain and fix, a true and just Composition, for all tithes, arising, growing, yielded or payable within the parish of Mayne in the County of Westmeath, do hereby certify that the true and just amount of Compositions, for all tithes whatever, within the said parish, is Two hundred and twenty two pounds £ , by the year, - of which sum of, Two hundred and twenty two pounds £ , five ninth parts, being One hundred and twenty three pounds, Six Shillings, and eight pence, are due and payable, to the Reverend Charles Browne, as a composition for the tithe, claimable by him as vicar, of the said parish, - and the remaining four ninth parts, being Ninety eight pounds, Thirteen Shillings, and four pence, are due and payable, to the Most Noble, the Marquis of Westmeath, as a composition for the tithe claimable by him, as owner of the Rectorial tithes, of said parish.

And we do further certify, that the average price of Oats, being the Corn principally grown in such County, for the period of seven years, ending on the 1st day of November, 1821, is fifteen shillings, and two pence farthing, per Barnet.
