appointed & sworn under & by virtue of an Act made in
the fourth year of the reign of King George the Fourth intituled
an Act to provide for the settling the compositions
for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time to ascertain
and fix a true and just composition for all tithes
arising growing yielded or payable within the Parish
of Moy in the County Mayo - Do hereby certify that
the true & just amount of compositions for all
Tithes whatever within the said Parish (as appears
by an agreement entered to at an Act of Vestry
held in pursuance of said Act & approved of by His
Grace the Arch Bishop of Thom - is two
hundred and sixty pounds by the year the
whole of which sum is due and payable to the
Reverend Thomas Townend as a composition for
the Tithes claimable by him as Rector & Vicar
of said Parish - and we do further certify that
the average price of oats being the corn principally
grown in such County for the period of seven
years ending the first day of November 1721
is fifteen Shillings & two pence per bush
being this fourteenth day of September 1724
