

I James French Commissioner duly appointed, and sworn under, and by Virtue of an Act passed in the Fourth year of the Reign of King George the Fourth, Entitled an Act to provide for the Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time, and by Virtue of an Act passed in the second, and third years of the Reign of His Majesty King William the Fourth, Entitled an Act, to amend three Acts, passed respectively in the Fourth, Fifth, and in the Seventh, and Eighth years of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, providing, for the Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such Compositions permanent, and to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all Tithes, arising, growing, yielding and payable within the Parish of Castrana-hon in the County of Cork, do hereby Certify that the true, and just composition, for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is Eight Hundred, and Ninety Seven Pounds Sixteen Shillings and Seven pence Sterling, by the year, of which sum of Eight Hundred and Ninety Seven Pounds Sixteen Shillings and Seven pence, is due and payable to the Reverend Francis Jones as Rector and Vicar of the said Parish.
