and sworn under and by Virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of King
The Reign of King George the fourth intituled an Act to provide for the
Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time
to Ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes
arising growing yielded or payable within the Parish of Minard in
The County of Kerry - Do hereby Certify that the true and just amount
of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is one
Hundred and seventy pounds by the year, of which sum of one hundred
and seventy pounds, the sum of Eighty five pounds being one half thereof
is due and payable to the Reverend Edwin Thomas as a Composition for
The Tithes Claimable by him as Vicar of said Parish the sum of Fifty
Six pounds thirteen shillings and four pence being the one third part
thereof is due and payable to the Right Honourable the Earl of Cork
and Oranah as Lay Impropriator, and that the sum of Twenty
Eight pounds six shillings and eight pence being the one sixth thereof
is due and payable to the Right Honourable Lord Venry as Lay Improp-
riator of said Parish. And We do further Certify that the
Average price of wheat being the Corn principally grown in such
County for the period of seven years ending on the first of
November one Thousand eight hundred and twenty one is one pound
Eighteen shillings and eight pence half penny sh^d per barrel and that
Average price of oats being also principally grown in such County
is fifteen shillings and two pence per barrel for the period
of seven years ending on the first day of November 1821 -
