And Whereas the said persons duly made such application as aforesaid in writing to the said justices at the said Quarter Sessions for the purposes aforesaid. And Whereas the said application came on for hearing before the said justices at the said Quarter Sessions commencing at Limerick on the said 3rd day of October 1895 and the said application being part heard the further hearing thereof was adjourned by the justices then presiding being his Honor the County Court Judge, Richard Adams Esq. 2^d C. and William F O'Grady Esq. J.P. to Saturday the 12th day of October 1895, And

Whereas on Saturday the 12th day of October 1895 at said adjourned Quarter Sessions the further hearing of the said application came on before the justices then assembled being the aforesaid Richard Adams 2^d C. and William F O'Grady J.P. and the Right Honorable Arthur Robert Viscount Southwell the owner of the said Tithe rent charge in the said Parish having appeared by Mr A. C. Meredith B.L. instructed by Messrs A O'Hagan & son Solicitors and the said persons having appeared by Mr Redmond Barry B.L. instructed by Mr Wm M. Beauchamp Solicitor And Whereas it was duly proved before the said justices at the said Quarter Sessions and at the said adjournment thereof that Notices in writing in the form aforesaid each duly signed as aforesaid had been duly posted pursuant to the statute in such case made and provided on two successive Sundays the last of which Sundays was more than 8 days before the holding of the said Quarter Sessions namely upon the 11th day of August and the 18th day of August 1895.
