I Valentine Browne Commissioner duly appointed, and Sworn under, and by Virtue of an Act of the 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> of William the 4<sup>th</sup> Chap<sup>r</sup> 119. Entitled an Act to make such Composition per-  
-menant, and to ascertain, and fix a true and just Composition for  
all Tithes, arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish  
of Montestown in the County of Cork. Do hereby Certify that the  
true and just amount of Composition, for all Tithes, whatever within  
the said Parish is Ninety Pounds by the Year - which sum of Ninety  
Pounds are due and payable to the Lords Longford & De Vescei as a Compo-  
-sition for the Tithes claimable by them as Lay Impropriators. And I do  
X Certify that during the continuance of the Leases, no Tithes will be  
Payable, but upon the expiration of these Leases, the Lords Longford  
& De Vescei will be entitled, to the sum ascertained, which is £90 per Annum  
I do further Certify the Average price of Wheat being the Corn principa-  
-lly grown in said County, for the period of Seven Years ending  
the 1<sup>st</sup> day of November 1830 Thirty is one pound Twelve Shillings  
& 1/2 per Barrel as per the Dublin Gazette.
