

The Parish of Monks-Town, in the Diocese of Dublin with its united Parishes, is a perpetual Curacy, to which the Dean of X^o Church or of the Holy Trinity nominates as Dean of X^o Church.

There are in the Union three Parishes, viz. Monks-Town, Kill, and Tullaght or Carrick Breannas.

Dalkey and Killyng Churches were, I believe, originally Chapels of ease for the convenience of the particular Parishes of Monks-Town or Tullaght. Hill-Organ is within the Parish of Kill.

Hilmacud is within the Parish of Taney. M^o Archbold Proprietor of that Town Land, pays two-third parts of the Tythe of it to the Dean of X^o Church and one third part to the Curate of Monks-Town.

Mount-Merrion, although in the Parish of Donnybrook pays one pound four shill^s that yearly to the Curate of Monks-Town.

For the Maintenance of the Curate of Monks-Town Tythes have been appointed by the Deans of X^o Church in the following Manner. All the Tythes in the Parish of Monks-Town; - the Tythe of the Farm called the Hill of the Grange, together with one third part of the Tythe of the Parish of Kill excepting the Lands of the Grange now in Lease to M^o Lowe, which pay Tythe to the Dean of X^o Church or his Lessee M^o Warren.

One third part of the Tythe of the Parish of Tullaght belongs to the Curate, excepting the Great Tythe of Breannas' Town, viz. the Tythe of Hay and Corn, which is reserved to the Dean and in Lease to M^o Warren: The Small Tythe
