

of this Town Land together with the small Dues thereof are appointed for the Curate. The Great Tythe of Dalkey belongs to the Dean, and is in Lease to Mr. Warren, the Small Tythe and small Dues belong to the Curate. Two third parts of the Tythe of Killyng belong to the Dean, and one third to the Curate. There is no Tythe paid on the Lands of St. Morgan, the Estate of Lady Allen, although, as I am informed, the Dean and Curate have an undoubted Right to it. — The Tenants of Leper's Town in the Parish of Hill, pay an acknowledgment of one pound p^o An^o, as a Gratuity to the Minister of Monks Town, for the use of a Pew in the Church. — Two third parts of the Black Rock and Bouter's Town Tythe, although in the Parish of Donnybrook, belong to the Dean of St. James Church, and one third to the Curate of Monks Town. The Tythe of Gish belongs to the Curate, and is usually set at the yearly Rent of five pounds.

The Tenant of the Glebe of the Gaem of the Hill pays the Curate of Monks Town a stipulated Rent for two Acres of Glebe. — Twelve Acres also of the Lands of Dalkey are by an Act of Parliament granted to the Curate of Monks Town, for which he pays a reserved Rent of four Shillings by the Acre to his Grace the L^o Arch. Bishop of Dublm. — Dated this 15th Day of May 1754.
