a Commissioner, duly appointed and sworn, under and by virtue of an Act made in the Second and Third Year of the Reign of King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend Three Acts passed respectively in the Fourth, Fifth, and in the Seventh and Eighth Years of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, providing for the Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such Compositions permanent," to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded, or payable within the Parish of Mosstown in the County of Louth Do hereby Certify that the true and just Amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever, within the said Parish, is two hundred and forty eight pounds fourteen shillings and eleven pence by the Year, of which Sum of two hundred and forty eight pounds fourteen shillings and eleven pence the entire is due and payable to the Reverend William Henry Foster as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by him as Rector and Vicar of the said Parish

And I do hereby Certify that the average price of Wheat being the Corn principally grown in such County, for the period of Seven Years, ending on the 1st day of November, 1830, is One Pound twelve shillings and one halfpenny per Barrel
