You are hereby required to take notice in pursuance of
an act passed in the second and third years of his present Majesty entitled
an act to amend three acts passed respectively in the fourth, fifth and
in the seventh & eighth years of the reign of his late Majesty King George
the fourth providing for Establishing of Compositions for tithes in Ireland
and to make such Composition payments, I Samuel W. Blackhall
of Coolcumber Manor in the County of Longford being seized in Fee simple
of all that and those the Lands of King'smyr's Downough Situate in the
Parish of Mostem Barony of Ardrugh County of Longford, the metes and
Bounds whereof are as follow, that is to say Bounded on the East by the
measuring of the Parish of Mostem, on the South by the Boy of Clonshunough, on
the West by the town Land of Crosslymore and on the south by the town Land
of Curdburgh which said townes and Lands are situate lying and being in
the Parish of Mostem Barony of Ardrugh and County of Longford, or
otherwise Entitled to agree for and undertake the payment of the Composition
for tithes, I am fully payable for and in respect of such Lands do hereby
signify to you my Desire to agree for and undertake the payment of such
Composition as aforesaid, for and in respect of the said Lands: and I hereby
require you to grant me a Certificate in writing, conformable to the provisions
of said act declaring me Entitled to the benefit of the said act, and to
perform the other Matter on your part required by the said act to be done
