

To all to whom these presents shall come, I, the Rev. George Keating Incumbent of the parish of Mostrim in the County of Longford send greeting. Whereas Samuel W. Blackall Esq^r in the County of Longford has truly served me with a notice in writing, in the words & figures following -

Sir, you are hereby required to take notice, that in pursuance of an act passed in the second & third years of his present Majesty entitled an act to amend three acts passed respectively in the fourth, fifth, & in the seventh & eighth years of the reign of his late Majesty King George the fourth, providing for establishing of Compositions for tithes in Ireland, & to make such Compositions permanent -

I Samuel W. Blackall of Colambrohan in the County of Longford being seized in fee simple of all that & those the lands of Ringrauney & Clascough situate in the parish of Mostrim, Barony of Ardagh & County of Longford, the metes & bounds whereof are as follow, that is to say bounded on the ~~West~~^{North} by the bog of Clonshunagh, on the West by the town land of Cranlymore, on the East by the meating of the parish of Street, & on the south by the town land of Corclaraugh, which said towns & lands are situate, lying & being in the parish of Mostrim, Barony of Ardagh & County of Longford, or otherwise entitled to agree for & undertake the payment of the Composition for tithes, lawfully payable for & in respect of such lands, do hereby signify to you my desire to agree for & undertake the payment of such composition as aforesaid, for & in respect of the said lands. And thereby require you to grant me a certificate in writing, conformable to the provisions of said act, declaring me entitled to the benefit of this notice, & to perform the other matters on your part, required by the said act to be done - Dated this 30th day of October 10³⁴
