

We John Fleming and Patrick Kearney Commissioners  
duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act  
made in the fourth year of the Reign of King George the fourth  
entituled an Act to provide for the establishing of Composition  
for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time, to ascertain and fix  
a true and just composition for all tithes arising, growing,  
yielded, and payable within the Parish of Moyvalty in the  
County of Meath, Do hereby certify that the true and  
just amount of composition for all tithes whatsoever within  
the said Parish is five hundred and fifty pounds <sup>£550.</sup> British  
by the year of which sum the whole is due and payable to  
the Rev<sup>d</sup> William Kellett as a composition for the Tithe  
claimable by him as Rector of said Parish. And we do  
further certify that the average price of wheat being  
the corn principally grown in such County for the period  
of seven years ending on the first day of November 1821 is  
£ 1-10-0<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> per Barrel - and we also further certify that a  
resolution was voted into and signed in the Vestry Book of  
said Parish that the Composition shall be invariables and  
independent of the average, during the continuance of our Act  
twenty years from the first of November 1827 - from -
