

We John Jones and William Vanston Commissioners  
duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an  
Act made in the fourth year of the Reign of King  
George the fourth, intituled an act to provide for the  
establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland  
for a limited time; to ascertain and fix a true and  
Just Composition for all tithes arising, growing,  
yreted, or payable within the perpetual Curacy or Parish  
of Moynne in County of Wicklow, do hereby Certify  
that the full and sufficient ~~and sufficient~~ Amount of  
Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said  
perpetual Curacy <sup>or Parish</sup> is two hundred pounds Sterling  
by the year - which sum of two hundred pounds is  
due and payable to Geo. Thomas Dooly as a Composi-  
sition for the Tithes claimable by him as perpetual  
Curate of the said perpetual Curacy <sup>or Parish</sup>. And we do  
further Certify that the Average price of Oats, being  
the principal Corn grown in said perpetual Curacy, <sup>or</sup>  
and adjoining parishes for the period of seven years  
ending on the first of November 1824 is fifteen Shillings  
and two pence farthing by the Barrel according  
to the Dublin Gazette.
