

Thomas Fitzgerald Commissioner duly appointed and sworn
under and by virtue of an Act made in the second and third
year of the Reign of King William the fourth entitled an Act to
Amend three Acts passed respectively in the fourth fifth and in
the seventh and eighth years of the Reign of his late Majesty
King George the fourth providing for the Establishing of
Composition for Tithes in Ireland and to make such Compo-
-sition permanent to ascertain and fix a true and just
Composition for all Tithes arising growing yielded or
payable within the Parish of Mucully in the County
Kilkenny do hereby Certify that the true and just amount
of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said
Parish is One Hundred and Fifty pounds by the year
of which sum of One Hundred and fifty pounds -
The sum of one Hundred pounds is due and payable
to the Mayor and Citizens of the City of Kilkenny as
a composition for the Rectorial Tithes.

And the sum of Fifty pounds of said One Hundred and
Fifty pounds - is due and payable to the Rev^d. James
Molesworth Pearson as a composition for the Vicarial
Tithes as Vicar thereof.

And I do further Certify that the average price of
wheat being the corn principally grown in such County
for the period of seven years ending on the first day of
November Eighteen Hundred and thirty is thirty two shilling
and one half penny per Barrel.
