

I hereby certify that in pursuance of the Order of the Justices of the Peace assembled at Quarter Session holden at Brandon, in and for the County West Riding on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of October 1868 the Composition for tithes of the Parish of Murragh, Diocese and County of Cork has been diminished according to the average price of wheat for the seven years preceding being £1.9.1 per Barrel as compared with the average price set forth in the Original Certificate of Composition, £1.12.10 that is to say from the sum of £851 to the sum of £753.17.9<sup>1</sup>/<sub>8</sub>
