

Cork County
West Riding
To Wit

By the Justices assigned to keep the Peace in and for
the County of Cork.

At a General Sessions of the Peace
held at Bandon in and for the Division of Bandon
in said Cork County West Riding on the Seventeenth day of October One
thousand eight hundred and Sixty eight. Whereas due notice of Application
having been first affixed at the time and in the manner directed by the Statutes
in such case made and provided, by the Reverend James Freke Rector and
Cur of the Parish of Murragh in the County of Cork, and in the Cork County
West Riding, and Division of Bandon, being the party entitled to, and in actual
receipt of Rent Charge in lieu of Composition for Tithes, arising and payable in
respect of the several lands chargeable therewith in the Parish of Murragh
aforesaid in the said County, Riding and Division, in pursuance of a certain
Certificate bearing date the sixteenth day of August One thousand eight " "
hundred and thirty three, whereby the gross Amount of Composition for all
Tithes whatever within the said Parish, was certified to be the Annual Sum
of Eight Hundred and fifty one pounds payable to the then Rector of said
Parish as therein mentioned, made an application in writing to the Justices
of the Peace of the said County, at the said Sessions above mentioned to have
the Average price of wheat, being the grain in said Certificate mentioned for
the preceding Seven years in the Statute in that behalf mentioned inquired
of and ascertained in Order that the said Composition for Tithes, and the
Rent Charge in lieu thereof might be varied and diminished according to
such Average price, as compared with the price or sum of One Pound
twelve shillings and ten pence per Barrell being the price of wheat in said
Certificate. And Whereas the said Reverend James Freke having appeared
in support of said Application by his attorney, and no other person having
appeared on the said Application, and the said Notice of application certificate
and that the said Reverend James Freke was entitled to Rent Charge in lieu
of Tithe Composition in said Parish, and the average price of wheat as ascer-
tained in the Dublin Gazette for the Seven years preceding, having been proved
Now the said Justices do ascertain from the said Gazette that the Average
price of wheat for the said period of Seven years is One pound nine shillings
and one penny per Barrell, and the Justices do accordingly Order and
adjudge that the Amount of the said Composition for Tithes in the said Parish
of Murragh, and the Rent Charge payable in lieu thereof shall be varied
and diminished in proportion to the difference between the Average price of
