

By the Justices assigned to keep the Peace in the  
County of Cork at a General Quarter Sessions  
held at Colerahetty in and for Cork County  
West Riding on the third day of July 1852

Whereas due notice was given by Sir Augustus Warren  
of Warren Court in the County of Cork Baron Thomas  
Officer of Woodfort Francis Deemish of Kellinor and John  
Scott of Gortmore all in said County Esquires being four owners  
of Land in the Parish of Murrugh in the Diocese of Cork and  
County of Cork each charged with the annual payment of  
Three pounds and upwards in respect of the Rent Charge  
payable in lieu of the Composition for Tithes within said Parish  
made by the Certificate of John Henry Agar bearing date the  
16<sup>th</sup> day of August 1833 in pursuance of the Statutes in  
such Case made and provided, whereby the Gross amount of  
Composition for all Tithes whatever in said Parish was  
Certified to be the annual Sum of Eight hundred and fifty  
one pounds  $\text{£}851$  and payable to the Rev Robert S. Lawrence  
as Rector & Vicar of the said Parish of Murrugh.

And Whereas the said four owners of Land duly made  
application in Writing to us the Justices of the Peace at  
these Quarter Sessions to have the average price of Wheat  
(being the Corn mentioned in the Certificate) for the 7 years  
now last preceding ascertained and ascertained in order that  
the said Composition in lieu whereof the said Rent Charge  
was payable may be diminished in proportion to such  
average price as compared with the price of Wheat set  
forth in said Certificate And Whereas the said  
application and the said Rev Robert S. Lawrence Rector  
and Vicar of said Parish of Murrugh having appeared  
before us the Justices here presiding and the said Certificate  
of Composition bearing date the 16<sup>th</sup> day of August 1833  
being duly proved and it appearing that the average  
price of Wheat stated therein was  $\text{£}9.12.0$  per Barrel  
and Whereas We the said Justices having ascertained  
the price of good marketable Wheat as advertised in  
the Dublin Gazette for the term of 7 years now  
preceding to be  $\text{£}1.70$  for each Barrel of 30 Stone
