

I, JOHN HENRY AGAR, Commissioner, duly appointed and sworn,—under and by virtue of an Act passed in the second and third years of the Reign of King William the Fourth, entitled “an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the fourth, fifth, seventh, and eighth years of the Reign of his late Majesty King George the Fourth, providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such Compositions permanent”—to ascertain and fix the true and just Amount of Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable in the Parish of MURRAGH, in the Diocese of Cork, and County of Cork, Do hereby Certify, that the true and just Amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever in said Parish, is *Eight Hundred and Fifty One Pounds Sterling*, by the year, which entire Sum of *Eight Hundred and Fifty One Pounds Sterling*, is due and payable to the Rev. ROBERT ST. LAWRENCE, as Rector and Vicar of said Parish.

And I do further Certify, that the Average Price of Wheat being the Chief, principally grown in said County during the Period of ~~Three~~ Years ending the 1st of November 1833, is *One Pound, Twelve Shillings and Ten Pence*, per Barrel.
