Commissioners duly appointed and sworn, under and by  
virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the reign of  
King George the fourth, entitled "An Act to provide for  
the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for  
a limited time" to ascertain and fix a true and just  
Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded, or  
payable within the Parish of Mangret, in the County of the City  
of Limerick and County of Limerick, do hereby certify, that  
the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes what-  
ever within the said Parish is seven hundred and twenty  
five Pounds by the year: of which sum of seven hundred  
and twenty five Pounds, two third parts are due and payable  
to the very Reverend Nathaniel Preston, Dean of Limerick  
as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by him as Rector  
of the said Parish; and one third part is due and payable  
to the Rev<sup>d</sup> Nathaniel Preston the Vicar of the said Parish.

And we do further certify, that the average  
price of Oats being the corn principally grown in such  
County for the period of seven years ending on the first  
day of November 1821 is fifteen Shillings and two pence  
nothing per Barrel
