I John Byrd a. Commissioner having been duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the 2nd and 3rd year of the Reign of his present Majesty King William the 4th Intituled an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the fourth fifth and in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of his late Majesty King George the fourth providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland ^{and to make such Compositions payable} and just composition for all tithes arising growing yielded or payable within the parish of Mullingar in the Diocese of Meath and County of Westmeath. ^{certly} It is hereby that the true and just amount of composition for all Tithes whatever within the said parish is Eight hundred pounds sterling by the year of which sum Three hundred and eighty five pounds sterling are due and payable to The Honorable and Reverend Henry Montague Browne as a composition for the tithes claimable by him as vicar of the said parish and of which sum Three hundred and eighty five pounds Seventy three pounds sterling are due and payable to the said Reverend Henry Montague Browne by the year as a Composition for all Tithes on the following townlands namely Cullinmore - Cullinbeg, Brookhagh & Quarry, situate within the said parish he being entitled to the Vicarial & Rectorial tithes of said townlands.

And the sum of Four hundred fifteen pounds sterling are due & payable to the trustees of the Kings Hospital Dublin as Owners of the Rectorial Tithes of said parish with the exception of the above named townlands
