

We Joseph Smith and William Allen Commissioners
duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made
in the fourth year of King George the fourth, entitled "an Act
to provide for the establishing of Compositions for Tythes in
Ireland for a limited time" to ascertain and fix a true and
just Composition for all Tythes arising growing yielding or
payable within the Parishes of Newcastle in the County of
Dublin Do hereby certify that the true and just Amount
of Composition for all Tythes whatever within the said
Parish is two hundred and fifty pounds Sterling by the
Year agreeably to the assent of the Bishop of the Diocese
and the Agreement between the Paritioners of said Parish
and the Incumbent of same as certified to us by Ignatius
Moore Chairman of a Special Vestry held in said Parish
on the twenty sixth day of March one thousand eight
hundred and twenty seven for the purpose of carrying
into effect the said Act, the whole of which sum of
two hundred and fifty pounds is due and payable to
The Reverend James Langrishe as a Composition for
the Tythe claimable by him as Rector and Vicar of
the said Parish. And we do further Certify
that the Average price of Wheat being the Corn principally
grown in such County for the period of seven Years ending
the first day of November one thousand eight hundred and
twenty one is one Pound eighteen Shillings and eight pence
half penny per Barrel late Irish Currency being one pound
fifteen Shillings and eight pence three farthings present Currency
as appears by the Returns from the Dublin Gazette (Dated
the ninth day of April 1827. (Seven)
