I John J. Lynch Esq. Commissioner  
having been duly appointed by His Excellency  
the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland under and by  
virtue of an act made in the second and third  
years of the reign of His present Majesty King  
William the fourth entitled "an act to amend  
three acts passed respectively in the fourth  
fifth and in the seventh and eighth years  
of the reign of His late Majesty King George  
the fourth providing for the establishing of  
composition for tithes in Ireland and to  
make such compositions permanent" to ascertain  
and fix a true and just composition for all  
the tithes arising growing yielded or payable  
within the parish of Newcastle in the Diocese  
of Dublin and County Wicklow according to  
the provisions of the said recited act and the  
acts recited therein -

Having been duly sworn do hereby certify  
that the true and just <sup>amount of</sup> compositions for all  
tithes whatever within the said parish is five  
hundred and forty two pounds three shillings  
and eleven pence sterling, by the year of which  
sum of five hundred and forty two pounds  
three shillings and eleven pence the sum  
of Two hundred and twenty two pounds
