Hundred & twenty One is Fifteen
Shillings & two pence farthings per Barrel

At a special meeting held on Thursday
November 11th 1824 pursuant to adjournment
for the purpose of taking into consideration the
above certificate

We do assent on behalf of the Owners & occupiers
of land in this Parish to the payment of the annual
composition contained in said certificate and we
do also signify our consent on behalf of the Owners
& occupiers of land that such annual compo-
sition shall be invariable for the term of twenty one
years from the 1st day of November ensuing
the date of such certificate viz from the 1st
day of November 1824 and that such annual
composition shall continue to be levied
for such term of 21 years & shall not be
subject to any Abatement in the amount thereof
during the period of 21 years under the provisions
of the Act of the 4th George 4 Chapter 99 or the 5th
George 4 Chapter 63 whatever the price of
Corn may be.
