# Tithe Composition

I Silvester Peit having been duly appointed, and sworn Commissioner, under and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the Reign of King George the Fourth intituled an Act to provide for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, for a limited time, and by virtue of an Act passed in the second and third years of the Reign of His Majesty King William the Fourth intituled an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively, in the fourth, fifth, and in the seventh, and eighth, years of his late Majesty King George the Fourth providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such Compositions permanent, and to ascertain and fix a true and just Amount of Composition, for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded, or payable within the Parish of Murree, in the County of Cildane, (Do hereby certify that the true and just Amount of Com<sup>o</sup>position for all Tithes whatever, within the said Parish & arising out of the following Towns Lands, viz<sup>t</sup> Murree, Clonemount, Killynaugh, Derryant, Tieravallagh, Balnennet, Williamstown, Ballycowan, and Kilmathmurry, is sixty six Pounds sixteen shillings & three farthings
