

Certificate of Composition for the Vicarial Tithe of
Odogh parish in the Diocese of Ossory

We John Wood of Somerton and John Maher of Freshford
Esquires both in the County of Kilkenny, Commissioners, duly
appointed, and Sworn under and by virtue of an Act, made
in the fourth year in the reign of King George the fourth
entituled an Act to provide for the Establishment of Composi-
-tion for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time to ascertain
and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes aris-
-ing growing yielded or payable within the Parish
of Odogh in the Diocese of Ossory and County of Kilkenn-
-ny, do hereby Certify that the true and just amount of
Composition for the Vicarial Tithe of said Parish is
One hundred Pounds Sterling of British Currency
by the year and is due and payable to the Reverend Peter
Roe as a composition for the Tithe claimable by him as
Vicar of said Parish

And we do further Certify that the average price
of Wheat, being the Corn principally grown in such
County for the period of Seven years ending the first
day of November 1821 is One Pound Eighteen Shillings
and eight pence halfpenny per barrel late Irish Currency
