

We Thomas White, and John Roberts (Commissioners
duly appointed and sworn, under and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth
year of the reign of King George the fourth, Intituled, an. Act to provide for
the Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited
time, to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes
arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of Offendane in
the Queens County. Do hereby Certify that the true and just Amount
of Composition for all Tithes whatsoever within the said Parish is Nine
Hundred Pounds Sterling by the year, being the sum agreed to, at and
by a Special Vestry hold pursuant to adjournment, on the 10th Inst. in said Parish
under the provisions of said Act, between the Honble and Rev. Joseph Burke
Dean of Ossory Rector & Vicar of said Parish, and said Special Vestry as
a Composition for all Tithes claimable by him as Rector & Vicar of said Parish
and said Composition to continue inviolable for a term of twenty one years.

And We do further Certify that the average price of Wheat, being
the Corn principally grown in said County for the period of seven years ending
the first day of November One thousand eight hundred and twenty one is
Twenty shillings per barrel.
