Quarter Sessions of the Peace in
and for the said County held at
Boyle in the said County on the
Eleventh day of October 1867.

Whereas Daniel Kelly and Arthur Browne Esquires
Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue
of an act made in the fourth year of the reign of King George
the fourth intitled "an act to provide for the establishing
of compositions for tithes in Ireland for a limited time"
as also by virtue of an act passed in the fifth year of
the reign of King George the fourth intitled "an act to
amend an act of the last session of Parliament for providing
for the establishing of composition for tithes in Ireland"
to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all
tithes arising growing yielded or payable within the
Parish of Ogula and County of Roscommon did by a
certain Certificate under their hands which was duly
registered in the office of the Registrar of the Diocese of
Elphin in which the said Parish is situate in the year one
thousand eight hundred and twenty five, Certify that the true
and just amount of composition for all tithes whatever
within the said parish was one hundred pounds two shillings
yearly which sum of one hundred pounds two shillings was
stated to be due and payable to the Very Reverend the Dean
of Elphin as a composition for the tithes claimable by him
as Rector of the said Parish and to be continued invariable
for twenty one years from the first of November one thousand
eight hundred and twenty five and that the average price of
oats being the Corn principally grown in said County for
the period of seven years ending on the first of November
one thousand eight hundred and twenty one was nine shillings
and six pence per barrell.

And Whereas the said Commissioners did
afterwards that is to say on the fifteenth of August one
thousand eight hundred and thirty five by writing under
their hands of that date certify that the amount of composition
for tithes in said Parish being so settled by their certificate
they had applotted the said sum of one hundred pounds
two shillings on the Townlands as set forth in the applotment
Book there to annexed and further had set forth the several
districts or parts of the said Parish liable to said
