duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an  
Act made in the fourth Year of the Reign of King  
George the fourth. Entitled an Act to provide for the  
establishing of compositions for tithes in Ireland for  
a limited time. To ascertain and fix a true and  
just composition for one quarter part of all Tithes,  
not including the lands of Ovanbeg and Frenchfort,  
arising growing yielded or payable within the Parish  
of Ovanmore Arch Diocese of Tuam and County of Galway  
Do hereby Certify that the true and just amount of  
composition for one quarter part of Tithes (excluding the  
lands of Ovanbeg and Frenchfort within said Parish of  
Ovanmore is Eighty Pounds five shillings and three pence  
Sterling, of which sum of Eighty Pounds five shillings  
and three pence being the proportion of One Quarter part  
of the Tithes of said Parish, not including the aforesaid  
lands of Ovanbeg and Frenchfort is due and payable to  
the Hon<sup>ble</sup> and Reverend Maurice Mahon and his Successors  
And We do further Certify that the average price of  
Oats being the Corn principally grown in such County  
for the period of seven years ending on the first day of  
November One Thousand eight hundred and twenty one  
is ten shillings and six pence by the barrel.
