

We John Hatch and Henry Harrison Clerks  
Commissioners duly appointed and sworn  
under and by virtue of an Act made in the  
fourth year of the reign of King George the fourth  
intituled 'An Act to provide for the establishment  
of Compositions for tithes in Ireland for a limited time  
to ascertain and fix a true and just composition  
for all tithes arrear, growing, yielded or payable  
within the Parish of Stoney in the Co. of Wick  
do hereby certify that the true and just amount  
of composition for all tithes whatsoever within  
the said Parish that are due and payable to the  
Rev. William Gregory as a composition for the  
tithe ascertainable by him as incumbent of the  
said Parish of Stoney has been agreed on between  
the said incumbent and the Parsonages of said  
Parish to be one hundred and eighty pounds  
by the Year, which sum includes one third of  
the tithes of the Parish of Stoney, the  
remaining two thirds of the tithes of said  
Parish being due and payable to the  
Marquis of Down. Whose true sum of  
one hundred and eighty pounds is due and  
payable to the said Rev. William Gregory  
as a composition for the tithes ascertainable
