Act to provide for the establishing of Composition
for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time to ascertain
and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes
arising, growing, yielded or payable within the
Parish of Painstown in the County of Meath, do
humbly Certify that the true and just amount of
Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said
Parish is Three hundred pounds by the Year, the
whole of which sum is due and payable to the
Rev. Ch. Praby as a Composition for the
Tithes claimable by him as Rector Incumbent of
said Parish, to remain invariable for the term of
twenty one Years from the first day of May
next ensuing the date hereof, and we further
Certify that the average price of Oats being
the Corn principally grown in such County
for this period of Seven Years ending on the
first day of Nov: are thousand eight hundred
and twenty one is fifteen Shillings and two pence
the Quarter.
