I John Palmer Howard having been
 duly appointed and sworn Commissioner, under the authority
 by Virtue of an Act made in the 2^d and 3^d Years of the
 Reign of King William the 4th Chapter 119 - and also
 an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively
 in the 1st 5th 7th and 8th Years of the Reign of
 Majesty King George the 4th providing for the
 -blething of Composition of Tithes in Ireland
 and to make such Composition permanent (Act of
 1832) to ascertain and fix a true and just
 -sition for all Tithes arising growing or
 payable within the Parish of Painsdown
 Counties of Carlow and Kildare - Do
 Certify that the true and just amount of
 for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish
 Eighty Nine Pounds and 1/2 by the Year - and that
 one third of that sum amounting to Twenty Nine
 Shillings and four pence is due and payable
 to the Rev^d Mr. Han. as a Composition for the Tithes
 by him as Rector of said Parish - and that the
 remaining two thirds amounting to Fifty Nine
 Five Shillings and Eight pence is due and payable
 to Walter B. Gurley - as a Composition for all Tithes
 claimed by him as Lessee of the Deane and Chapter
 of Leighlin

And I do further Certify the Average Price
 of Wheat being the Corn principally grown in said
 Parish for the period of the Seven Years ending the
 1st November 1830 is one Pound twelve Shillings
 per Barrel -
