intituled an Act to provide for establishing of Compositions  
for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time, to ascertain and  
fix a true and just composition for all tithes arising  
growing, Yielding or payable within the Parish of  
Rahill in the County of Carlow, do Certify that the  
True and just amount of such Composition for all  
Tithes whatever within the said Parish of Rahill  
is Two hundred pounds by the Year, which sum of  
Two hundred pounds is due and payable to the  
Rev<sup>d</sup>. John Whitty as a Composition for the Tithes  
claimed by him as Owner of the Rectorial  
and Vicarial Tithes of said Parish

And we do further Certify that  
the average price of Oats, being the Corn principally  
grown in said County, for the period of Seven Years  
next preceding the first day of November. One thousand  
eight hundred and Twenty and is fifteen Shillings &  
two pence farthing per Barrell.
