and sworn under and by virtue of an Act passed in the
Second and Third years of the Reign of His Majesty King
William the Fourth Intituled an Act to amend three
Acts passed respectively in the Fourth, Fifth, and
in the Seventh and Eighth years of the Reign of His
late Majesty King George the Fourth providing
for the Establisment of Compositions for Tithes in
Ireland and to make such compositions permanent

To Ascertain and fix a true and just composition
for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable
within the Parish of Rathspick in the County of
Westmeath, do hereby Certify that the true and just
Amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within
the said Parish is One Hundred and Twenty
Eight pounds five Shillings 6^d by the Year

Which Sum is due and payable to Sir John
Bennett Piers Bart. as a Composition for
all Tithes claimable by him as Rector, or as
Owner of the Rectorial Tithes of the said
Parish. And I do further Certify that the
average price of Oats being the Corn principally
grown in such County for the period of
seven years next preceding the first day
of November One thousand Eight Hundred
and Thirty, is Thirteen Shillings and three
pence three farthings per Barrell.
