I William Hamilton Parker Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an act made in the second and third years of the Reign of His Majesty King William the Fourth entitled an act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the fourth fifth seventh and eighth years of the Reign of the late Majesty King George the Fourth providing for the Composition of Tithes in Ireland, and to make such Compositions permanent, to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising growing yielded or payable within the Parish of Rathbarry in the Diocese of Ross and County of Cork do hereby certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is Four hundred and eleven pounds thirteen shillings and ten pence of which sum of Four hundred and eleven pounds thirteen shillings and ten pence the sum of one hundred and seventy four pounds two shillings and eleven pence halfpenny is due and payable to the Reverend Henry Stewart as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by him as Vicar of the said Parish, and the sum of eighty seven pounds one shilling and five pence is due and payable to Michael Roberts Esq<sup>r</sup> as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by him as one of the Lay Impropriators of said Parish, and the sum of eighty seven pounds one shilling and five pence is due and payable to Thomas Wade Esq<sup>r</sup> as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by him as the other Lay Impropriator of said Parish, and the sum of
