

J. William Hamilton Porter, Commissioner duly
appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act
made in the second and third years of the reign of His
Majesty King William the Fourth intituled "an Act
to amend three Acts passed respectively in the fourth,
fifth, seventh and eighth years of the reign of his late
Majesty King George the Third, providing for the
composition of tithes in Ireland; and to make such
compositions permanent" — to ascertain and fix a
true and just composition for all tithes arising, growing
or payable within the Parish of Flathbeg in
the Diocese of Ross, and County of Cork do hereby certify,
that the true and just amount of composition for all
tithes whatsoever within the said Parish is Four hundred
and eleven pounds, thirteen shillings and Ten pence
of which sum of four hundred and eleven pounds, thirteen
shillings, and Ten pence, the sum of one hundred and
seventy four pounds, Two shillings and eleven pence halpenny
is due and payable to the Reverend Henry Stewart as a
composition for the tithes claimable by him as Vicar of
the said Parish, and the sum of eighty seven pounds
one shilling and five pence is due and payable to
Michael Roberts Esq^r as a composition for the tithes
claimable by him as one of the lay proprietors of
said Parish, and the sum of eighty seven pounds, one
shilling and five pence is due and payable to
Thomas Wade Esq^r as a composition for the tithes
claimable by him as the other lay proprietor of
said Parish, and the sum of sixty three pounds, seven
shillings
