the Parish Church of Rathcoole in the Co. of Dublin and Dioc. of
Dublin of which due notice was given and given and those
vestry men that were deacons & to vote were present on Wednesday
the 3rd day of Oct. last under and by virtue of the act of the 4th of
George the fourth Chap. 99. (Intit. to provide for
the establishing for compositions of Tythes in Ireland for a
limited time) That it was then and there agreed upon
by and between John Peirson Esq. of Dugit St. the Deputy
agent of the Hon. & Roy. Hon. Dem. of St. Patrick, the Proprietor
of the Rectorial Tythes of the said Parish and the Parishioners
then present that the sum of Sixty Pounds Sterling by the year
be paid by them as a composition for all the Rectorial Tythes yearly
and payable to him for the term of twenty one years to commence
from the 1st day of Oct. next.
