

At a special vestry held in the Parish  
Church of Rathcoole in the County and  
Diocese of Dublin on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of June  
1827 under and by virtue of the act of  
the fourth of George the fourth Chap<sup>r</sup> 99  
intituled an act to provide for the establishing  
of composition for Tythes in Ireland for a  
limited time, and at which not less than  
seven persons entituled to vote were present,  
Resolved that it was agreed upon, that the  
sum of Two hundred and fifty pounds  
sterl<sup>g</sup> per year be paid to the Rev<sup>d</sup> Thomas  
Hayden Vicar of Rathcoole and Collierstown  
as a compensation for all the Tythes arising  
and payable out of all the Lands subject to  
pay Tythes to the said Rev<sup>d</sup> Thomas Hayden  
out of the said parish of Rathcoole and  
Collierstown, and we hereby nominate  
Mr John Booth of Blundellstown Commis-  
sioner on our behalf to meet and treat  
with Mr Squatier Moore of Newcastle  
the Commissioner appointed by the Rev<sup>d</sup> Tho<sup>s</sup>  
Hayden — resolved that this composition  
shall continue in force for Twentyone years
