 Ireland, for a limited time," to ascertain and fix a true and  
 just Composition for all Tithes arising growing yielded and  
 payable within the Parish of Glondalkin in the County of Dublin  
 do hereby certify, that the true and just amount of  
 Composition for all Tithes whatsoever within the said Parish  
 1813-14-15 is five hundred <sup>thirteen</sup> ~~and~~ <sup>three</sup> pence <sup>three</sup> pence <sup>three</sup> pence,  
 by the year, of which sum of five hundred <sup>thirteen</sup> ~~and~~ <sup>three</sup> pence  
<sup>three</sup> pence <sup>three</sup> pence <sup>three</sup> pence <sup>three</sup> pence <sup>three</sup> pence <sup>three</sup> pence  
 and payable to The Reverend Richard Ponsonby as a Composition  
 for the Tithes claimable by him as Rector of the said Parish  
 and one twelfth part thereof is due and payable to The  
 Reverend John Read the Vicar of the said Parish. And we  
 do further certify that the Average price of Wheat being  
 the Corn principally grown in such County for the period of  
 seven years ending the first day of November one thousand  
 eight hundred and twenty one is one pound <sup>fifteen</sup> ~~and~~ <sup>three</sup> shillings  
 and eight pence <sup>three</sup> pence <sup>three</sup> pence <sup>three</sup> pence <sup>three</sup> pence  
 per Barrell <sup>three</sup> pence <sup>three</sup> pence <sup>three</sup> pence <sup>three</sup> pence <sup>three</sup> pence  
 by the Dublin Gazette.
