of King George the 4th intitled "an Act to provide for the
Establishing of Compositions of Tithes in Ireland" to ascertain
a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising growing
yielded or payable within the parish of Rathcline in the
County of Longford do hereby Certify that the true & just
Amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within
the said Parish is Three Hundred & Ninety three
Pounds ten shillings by the year of which sum of
Three Hundred & Ninety three pounds ten shillings,
Two third parts are due & payable to M^r C^o Armstrong
Esq^r as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by them
as Lay Impropriators, and one third part is due &
payable to the Rev^d James Barrett, the Vicar of the
said Parish - And I do further Certify that
the average price of Oats being the Corn principally
grown in such County for the period of 7 years
ending on the 1st day of November 1830 is 12th 1/2
shillings -
