ascertain and fix a time and just composition for all tithes arising  
growing yielded or payable within the Parish of Rathens in  
the P<sup>o</sup> of Meath do hereby certify that the time and just amount  
of Compositions for all Tithes whatsoever within the P<sup>o</sup> Parish of  
is Eight hundred and seventy five Pounds of Irish currency  
being Eight hundred and seven pounds thirteen shilling and  
ten pence of British currency by the year of which sum the  
sum of Four hundred and seventy five Pounds of Irish currency  
is due and payable to William Allen Esq. as Vicar of the  
Rectorial tithes of P<sup>o</sup> Parish as a composition for all Tithes  
claimable by him and the sum of Four hundred Pounds of  
Irish currency is due and payable to the Rev. Richard  
Ryan as Vicar of P<sup>o</sup> Parish and we do further certify  
that the average price of wheat for the period of seven years  
ending the 31<sup>st</sup> of November 1824 was 14.18.0<sup>0</sup>/<sub>4</sub> per barrel and  
the average price of oats for the same period 15.2<sup>0</sup>/<sub>4</sub> per barrel
