Certificate of Composition

We Peter Roe and Thomas White Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the reign of King George the fourth entitled an Act to provide for the establishment of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded, or payable, within the Parish of Rathdowney in the Queen's County, do hereby Certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes, whatsoever within the said Parish is Seven hundred and fifty pounds by the year of which sum of Seven hundred and fifty pounds Two third parts are due and payable to the Hon^{ble} and Rev^d Joseph Burke as a Composition for the Tithe claimable by him as owner of the Rectorial Tithe, One third part is due and payable to the Rev^d Marcus Monck, Vicar of the parish as a Composition for the Vicarial Tithe claimable by him out of said parish of Rathdowney

And we do further Certify, that the average price of Wheat being the Corn principally grown in said County for the period of ~~seven~~ years ending the first day of November one thousand eight hundred and Twenty one is Twenty Shillings per Barrel
