

We, Sir Robert Shaw, of Bushy Park, in the County of Dublin, Bart<sup>r</sup>, and George Wharton of Meadow Bank, in said County Esquire, Commissioners duly appointed and sworn, under and by Virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the reign of King George the Fourth, entitled, "An Act to provide for the establishing of Composition for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time", to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes, arising, growing, yielded, or payable within the Parish of Rathgarham, in the County of Dublin, do hereby Certify, that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever, within the said Parish, is, Three hundred and fifteen pounds, Sterling, by the year, which sum of Three hundred and fifteen pounds, Sterling, is due and payable to The Venerable John Tarens, Archdeacon of Dublin, as a Composition for the Tithe; claimable by him as ecclesiastical Incumbent of the said Parish of Rathgarham - said sum of Three hundred and fifteen pounds Sterling, having been agreed to by the said Incumbent, with the consent and writing of His Grace the Archbishop of Dublin, as Bishop of the Diocese, and Patron of the Beneice, and assented to, and accepted at a Special Vestry duly assembled, under the provisions of said Act, in the said Parish on Monday the Eleventh day of October 1824, and to be invariable for the term of Twenty-one years, from the first day of November 1824.

And we do further Certify that the average price of oats, being the Corn principally grown in said County, for the period of seven years, ending on the First of November 1821, is Fifteen shillings, and two pence farthing per barrel?
