Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and  
by Virtue of an act made in the fourth year of the  
reign of King George the fourth intitled an Act to provide  
for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland  
for a limited time to ascertain and fix a true and just  
Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded  
or payable within the parish of Rathgriff in the County  
of Westmeath do hereby Certify that the true and  
just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever  
within the said Parish is Two Hundred and three  
Pounds one Shilling and six pence halpenny of  
which sum of two hundred and three Pounds one  
Shilling and six pence halpenny, five ninth parts being  
One hundred and twelve Pounds sixteen Shillings and  
four pence all due - and payable to the Reverend  
Chauvorth Drumm as a Composition for the Tithes  
claimable by him as Vicar of the said Parish, and  
the remaining five ninth parts being Ninety Pounds  
five Shillings and three halpence all due and payable  
to the most noble the Marquis of Westmeath as lay  
Proprietor of the said Parish -

And we do further  
Certify that the average price of Oats being the Corn  
principally grown in said County for the period of  
seven years ending on the first day of November  
1821 is fifteen Shillings and two pence halpenny per
